Attendance

Attendance winners

All children who have achieved an attendance of 97% + over the past 3 weeks have been awarded a special certificate. We also held a randomised raffle during

assembly where a child from each class was chosen to receive the attendance prize of a board game and additional prizes of Easter eggs. All children who achieved 97%+ attendance over the past 3 weeks were entered, as well as some children whose attendance has greatly improved or deserves a special inclusion in the draw. A big well done to all those children who won an attendance prize we hope you enjoy playing your board games and Easter eggs!

After Easter, for the Summer term, we will be going to another incentive of each class who achieves over 97% attendance receiving a 'kitty' prize of £5, £2 and £1 respectively for the highest whole class attendance over 97%. They will bank the money each week and be able to spend it on a fun activity at the end of the half term.

Authorisation for Absences

The current government advice is still:

If your child is displaying any of these COVID related symptoms...

- -a high temperature
- -a new, continuous cough
- -a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

You should:

1) Keep your child off school, inform the school office and book a test.

- 2) Siblings or members of a childcare bubble must remain off school until test results are back -The whole family should self-isolate until the test results are returned.
- 3) If test is negative, your child/children can return to school (as long as they are well)
- 4) If test is positive, keep your child at home for 10 days, other family members need to isolate for 10 days.

Please contact school **immediately** so we can track and trace within the schools bubbles.
