A reminder that families can apply for Free School Meals via this link: https://www.stockport.gov.uk/free-school- meals/apply-school-grants-free-school-meals - all you need is your NATIONAL INSURANCE NUMBER. If your child is going into year 3 in September they will no longer be on Universal Free School Meals, so if you think you might qualify please apply before the Summer break.

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, it is beneficial to apply for Free School Meals as your child can also access a range of other benefits and school help supplement some additional provision for you and your child(ren).

Cars idling outside school

An issue of great concern has been reported to me this week: cars have been idling (leaving your vehicle engine running while stationary) outside school when waiting by the fence area.

Please switch off your car engine if you are waiting outside school, for any length of time – even if only for a few minutes. The fumes alone are extremely hazardous to everyone's

<u>health</u> – especially young children – and it is made even worse in the winter months.

In doing so, any drivers who are choosing to idle either at drop off or pick up, are breaking rule 123 of the Highway Code and putting other people's health at risk.

Parent Governor vacancy info:

We encourage applications from all members of society, regardless of background, gender, ethnicity, disability or age (as long as you're over 18).

Skills you will gain:

School governance allows you to develop your skills, both personally and professionally:

- Strategic planning
- Experience on a board
- Holding senior leaders to account
- Finance, and maintaining oversight of potentially multi-million pound budgets
- Human resources and performance management
- Project management
- Marketing
- Communication and teamwork
- Decision making

Time - governance usually requires about 6-8 hours per month (term time only)

The role - parent governors are not delegates and do not speak 'on behalf' of the parent body. The role and responsibilities of parent governors are no different from those of the other governors

Experience - school governors are the largest volunteer force in education, with around 250,000 governors in the UK. The successful candidate will receive full training. CPD is extremely important to our governing board.

Please do consider applying when the advert is published: there is a national vacancy rate of 10% - i.e. there are a lot of empty governor seats so we do need your input.

Covid-19 advice

- Children with mild symptoms of a respiratory infection include covid-19 but are otherwise well should continue to attend school. They should stay home if they have a high temperature and are unwell, and can return to school when they no longer have a high temperature/feel well enough.
- It is not recommended that children should have a covid-19 test unless directed to by a health professional, but if a child under 18 does test positive, they should stay off school for 3 days after the day they took the test. They can return to school after the 3 days if they are well enough.

The isolation period for COVID-19 is 6 days with a negative LFD test (24 hours apart on day 5 and day 6). See the link below for more information

School advice is still:

If your child is displaying any of these COVID related symptoms

- -a high temperature
- -a new, continuous cough
- -a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

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if your child receives a positive lateral flow test, they should remain at home until they are feeling well again.

Please inform school if anyone in your child's household tests positive for Covid-19.
