# **Remote Learning Feedback**

Thank you to all those parents and carers who took part in the survey. From this we can share the following excellent news:

- 95% of families who responded to the survey are accessing home learning
- Everyone is enjoying the zoom lessons and families were particularly pleased with the zoom check-ins each day with class teachers
- Families commented that they are grateful the teachers are there for anything, not just learning related queries
- Children are enjoying the zoom lessons with examples shown
- 'The quick feedback is a real positive'

When we asked what we could do to make home learning even better, families responded that they generally were pleased as the learning is focused, differentiated between classes and the examples shown were effective. Some families asked if the topics could be shared before the lesson so that any pre-teaching or research could be done, so we will try to work on that over the coming weeks.

# The current government advice is still:

If your child is displaying any of these COVID related symptoms...

- -a high temperature
- -a new, continuous cough
- -a loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

You should:

1) Keep your child off school, inform the school office and book a test.

- 2) Siblings or members of a childcare bubble must remain off school until test results are back -The whole family should self-isolate until the test results are returned.
- 3) If test is negative, your child/children can return to school (as long as they are well)
- 4) If test is positive, keep your child at home for 10 days, other family members need to isolate for 10 days.

Please contact school immediately so we can track and trace within the schools bubbles.

If you need medical advice the 111 website does have a symptom checker and will explain what to do.
